There are three main reasons why I wanted to do this disc:

- 1) Document the past and current bands.
- 2) Provide a financial resource from the money received above the break even point to reinvest into releasing other local material, mostly 7"s.
- 3) And to get people involved, therefore revitalizing the scene and having some fun. And I guess also to put the L.V. on the map for the right reasons!

YOW! Big undertaking!

The Lehigh Valley is in Pennsylvania. About 60 miles North of Philadelphia. The area encompasses the Allentown, Bethlehem, Easton and surrounding areas.

Maximum RocknRoll's "Not So Quiet on the Western Front" compilation lp/zine was the inspiration for this project. Each band got a page for whatever they wanted in the zine that accompanies the disc. Hopefully FOE will eventually be able to support the L.V. and maybe even Philly and parts inbetween like other "scene" oriented record labels.

Everyone donated to the cause. Bands donated their music and artwork, the attendees of the benefit gig donated their \$3 of the \$5 admission price and I donated my life savings. See the thank you list for the rest. Hopefully you think this is worthwhile, all those involved think it is, regardless of recording quality, artistic abilities or professionalism. It's about the heart. And hopefully it'll be the building block to give this area a friggin' kick in the butt! There are lots of ideas for future releases. I INTERVIEWED PETE OF WOOL, WHO USED TO BE IN SCREAM AND THAT GUY FROM NIRVANA USED TO BE IN THAT BAND TOO, BUT I DIDN'T TALK TO HIM, BUT WE TALKED ABOUT HIM. DIGS TRANSCRIBED THIS INTERVIEW!

WOOL OK I've got some time here, I'm doing my wash.

FOE Cool, I did mine last night.

WOOL Yeah, I gotta go down the road to the laundromat.

FOE I did mine at my fiance's parents house.

WOOL Cool. What's your zine's name?

FOE Freedom of Expression, but mostly it's known as F.O.E.

WOOL FOE, not related to the Fraternal Order of the Elks.

FOE No, nor the distribution place that sells shirts either, who advertized in the latest Hard Rock Comics with Nirvana in it, which leads me to my first question... Did you know they mentioned *Scream* in the comic?

WOOL Really? Was it in a derogatory sense?

FOE No, it was just how they got your drummer. It shows a picture of David Grohl with a caption saying "Discusses life with his band mates in *Scream*". They got him saying, "This is great, we're staying in a house with 3 mud wrestlers, we got gigs lined up, what more could we ask for." They you say, "A bass player, he quit, the band is history."

WOOL Sounds pretty funny.

FOE So is that what happened?

WOOL Well. Yeah. Pretty much. Then he packed his bags and went to Seattle.

FOE So when did you move to California?

WOOL We just never left after the break up. We didn't have enough cash to get home. I didn't feel like bugging my parents for money and my sister lived here so we just hung around and got jobs out here... It was probably for the best. We'd been doing *Scream* for a long time and it was very fulfilling but it was time to move on and do different things.

FOE So why did you decide not to continue with the name *Scream*?

WOOL It really is a different band and there was really no sense in that I think it's kinda tacky or whatever.

FOE So you don't do any *Scream* or *Government Issue* songs.

WOOL Nope. Tomorrow I'm actually going back to DC and me, Dave Grohl and Franz are finishing the last *Scream* record. That will be coming out real soon on Dischord. I think *Scream* will probably do some shows, cuz Dave has a lot of free time on his hands, cause Nirvana doesn't play that much.

FOE How did you hook up with Pete?

WOOL He was travelling the country and he visited LA and we started jamming and he wanted a change from DC. DC is a real small scene and it's a great scene and everything but when your in a band for 9 years, sometimes you want a change. So he wanted to try something different. It's a real challenge to go to a town where you don't know anyone and you start from scratch.

FOE How'd you hook up with AL?

WOOL He worked at the record store down the road, and Dimwit from DOA introduced us. We seemed to have a lot of the same feelings about music and it's hard to find the right people in this town.

FOE What is the difference between DC and the San Fernando Valley?

WOOL The surf...

FOE What I mean is, if Wool was based in DC would there be a difference?

WOOL Definitely. Here you have to deal with the LA rock scene. Pay to play and stuff like that. I come

from a different school with lower door prices, all ages and here there are always big shows. There's a lot more bullshit. We made fun of it on the vinyl version of our album, our ep actually. We made a bunch of prank phone calls to adds in the paper looking for musicians. It's really hilarious, the responses you get. I really hated this town when I first got here. I wanted to move to San Francisco, cause I find the vibe down there to be much more creative. We met L7 and I was readying for them and I met a lot of cool people through them and I was hanging out at this art gallery/coffee shop called JabberJaw. It's in a bad part of town but it's a cool outlet for new bands and it's all ages and low door prices. The creativity is really inspiring and I started seeing different shops around LA. So I decided to stay. There's a lot of cool bands coming out of LA. Trash Can School, Spoon, Caesar Salad, Down By Law. So it picked up a lot.

FOE The record label you are on, External, it's a division of London records... which is part of Polygram or something like that?

WOOL Exactly.

FOE How is that working out?

WOOL The people are really cool. They seem to understand where we're coming from. We try to tell them that we're not really interested in selling a lot of records, we just wanna make music and get it out there. We're not really interested in being the next big thing. The only thing I'm not too happy with is the distribution, but the records only been out for 2 months, so we'll see how things go. We put our first two singles out with some of our friends. It was just a different avenue for us to get our music out. The first two singles were done in basement studios and we did the new ep in three weeks. We actually walked to the studio. I don't think the sound strays too far away from the singles. We used the same producers as we did on the second single.

FOE I think the new ep is a classic, just like the first *Scream* record. I get the same feeling listening to both of those records. **WOOL** It's a good feeling, it's a positive feeling. Our new tape which we did up in Seattle with Dave Grohl, in his basement studio, will be tons better. We did 17 songs. I think that will be out on London, so it will get wider distribution than if it were on External. I don't really know, it might end up that we'll release it ourselves and just subvert the

whole system. We won't sit around and wait for the bullshit. It is a machine. The big labels. You have to deal with so many people at different levels. That even happened with Scream. We had a lot of material, and wanted to release it all. By the time a record got released we didn't even want to play those songs anymore, we'd have a whole new set.

FOE How'd that Scream lp come out on RAS Records (the reggae label)?

WOOL The guy that ran RAS approached us about it. We thought he was cool and we identified with the politics of a lot of it, and the artists, and a lot of the songs of revolution, and standing up for yourself and we thought that it would be cool, to be a part of that. He wanted to expand his label,

beyond reggae. He said he was going to sign a few other bands like us and I guess the others didn't work out. So we were the only ones that put a record out with him. He just lost interest then I guess. It was disappointing and we were kind of deceived but such is life. Move on.

FOE I wanna go back and talk about the first Scream lp. The words that are on the front cover. Do you still feel like that now?

And what are some of the lyrics to the songs off of the ep.

WOOL I still feel like I'm screaming about how I feel. I think "S.O.S." is basically screaming for fucking help. Living in this city is so fucking crazy, that its like white people are just scared. People are scared. All the people with money are moving out. They move and they are still scared. The biggest industry in this town is security. There has been more guns bought here since the riots last year. Its armed. There are a lot of areas people won't drive through because they are scared that they'll be pulled out of their cars. "S.O.S." was written before the riots, but I could feel the fear as soon as I moved here. I saw a big difference in Southern California, from when I first moved here like 4 or 5 years ago. Just the homeless situation is unbelievable. On every fucking off ramp there are entire families standing at the edge saying they'll work for food. Its like the depression. I remember one time I was in NY and there was a whino, before you get to the Holland Tunnel, it said S.O.S. whino in distress or something. That's where I got the first line from. He was asking for money for whine research. We put extra an extra song on the vinyl and put some of those phone calls on the vinyl. "Love My Guns" is the extra track. Its how when you are little, I remember growing up and waiting to get my new space gun or something for Christmas. It has a storyline of a kid getting a gun, the kid joining a gang, how its a game but you are playing it for real, and the kid ends up working for the army. Some of the songs are real personal. Like "F". Its a song about a friend of mine that gets caught up in heroin. It seems lately I know a lot of girls involved in it. It seems cocaine is passe. Heroin is moving back in.

FOE Yeah I've noticed it here, its use is disturbing.

WOOL Its weird. When you aren't a part of that world. That's what the song is about. The way it just pulls, there is nothing you can do about it. "Medication" is a personal song too. My stepbrother killed himself last year. Its about the whole feeling I had the day after. "Slightly Under" is

about being really down. I wrote that about a friend of mine's feelings on her birthday, not knowing who her parents were. "Wait" is sung by our bass player. I hope the songs have different meanings for people. It doesn't have to have my meaning.

FOE I didn't get a chance to decipher the lyrics, but the music definitely has a positive feel to it. Like a fighting feeling. But when you add the lyrics which are about a lot of bad or depressing things, the music still gives it a different perspective, than if you were just reading the lyrics. Do you know what I mean.

WOOL That's why I didn't put the lyrics in there. So its all open to interpretation. Just let the passion of the music come through and effect the people that way. I put my heart into everything I

do. The soul just comes through and speaks for itself. That's one thing that's distant in a lot of music and a lot of art and in our culture period, passion and soul.

FOE If you did music full time as your occupation would you lose that?

WOOL Depends on what level. If I was in Dave's position where financially he doesn't have to work, and he doesn't have to cruise around in a van, I don't know. I probably wouldn't do music anymore. I would pick up and go skydiving or something. Something I could get the next thrill from. My experience in music its always been a struggle. And getting the music out and touring and paying the bills. I can't see it any other way.

FOE So when are you playing PA?

WOOL We haven't played Philly yet, we tried to get in the Khyber. I like Philly. Its like a small Chicago or something. I haven't been there in years. The way the neighborhoods, there are real ethnic neighborhoods, Old Time City Irish neighborhoods. Here in LA its Spanish everywhere. Its cool its different, but its so spread out. It doesn't have the same vibe as a city. We played at State College twice. At a VFW Hall. Well look man, I gotta get going.

FOE Get to that laundry.

WOOL Gotta do that shit. Talk to ya later.

BIM SKALA BIM "Bones" cd BIB

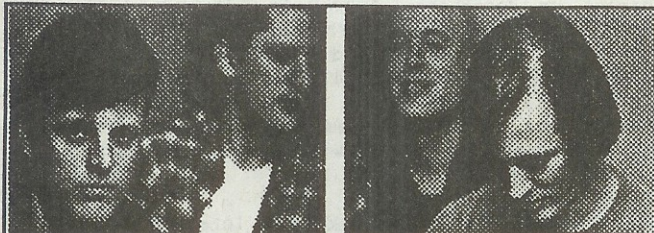

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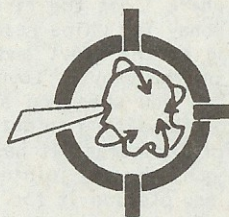

COFFIN BREAK "Thirteen" cd

If you're familiar with C.B., you know they have a shitload of killer "heavy and almost repetitive" tunes with an occasional "short very melodic poppy you gotta be kidding this is the same band" song thrown in. Which always made me say "shit, that's worth the record alone"! OK. New release. What the fuck have they done? Believe it or not, I miss the old dirgy simple guitar leads. This cd is 90% melodic. Lacking even a quarter of the punch I expected. Rock n roll? Possible mainstream seller? Songs too long? A few songs lumped into the Seattle thang? Yeah! There's nothing wrong with that but... didn't they think of me? (KALE)

CHAINSAW KITTENS "High in High School" cd
Mammoth

Alright! Let's say Janes Addiction never released their first big selling record. This would be the band that would take their place energy wise. And one mother friggin killer cover of Three Dog Nites "One". Very impressive. So impressive I made Chuck Mammyhouse buy me their first lp "Flipped out in Singapore" for my birthday! CONSOLIDATED "Play More Music" cd, Network

Get this. I was unfamiliar with this band prior to hearing this. Knew about them just didn't hear em. From Disposable Heroes of Hiphoprisy rap to hardcore to whatever. All very original sounding. There is dialog from concerts they've played which is very challenging and makes this a required listen. Thought provoking good music.

C.O.C. "Technocracy" and "Vote with a Bullet"
cds, Relativity

Bang your head, raise your fist and yell! C.O.C. were the forefathers of the crossover movement (them and DRI, ed) and with rerelease of "Techno.", their classic jrm, metalhead and punks are in for a frenzy. Five tracks with Simon Bob and four tracks with Mike Dean who is THE vocalist. A metalheads wet dream and must buy.

"Vote" is by the new C.O.C., the death, indy C.O.C. They made this song around campaign time and I gotta say its a good "let your voice be heard" rocknroll song. Rock the vote man. The remixes aren't bad either, which is no wonder, seeing as they were done by Philip Steir and Mark Pistel of Consolidated. (DIGS)

Whoda thought that this would rule. I figured they'd be too tired from thrashing the world over to write any new cool tunes. This has as much or more energy than even their first releases! Crunch go the guitars, the unmistakable vocals and they blaze on some of these tunes. They also experiment a little with good success. Easy to listen to and I'd recommend it!

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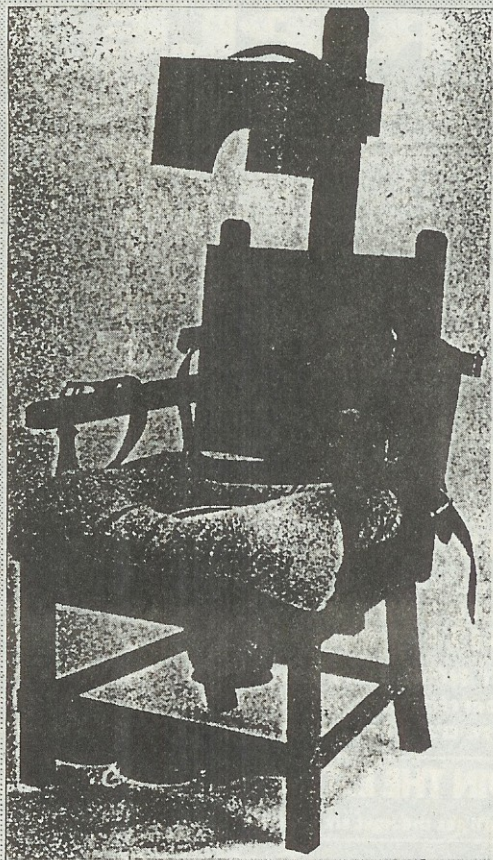
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HUMAN BRAIN PUT IN CHIMP

DIDJITS "Little Miss Carriage" 12" Touch and Go

Need a reason to stay alive? Become a fan of the Didjits. Rock gods. Cool grooves. Excellent vocals. Great fun attitude. This is the band. Everything they've ever done is a classic. They do a song about Jimmy. They rock! Fast, energetic, punk and hooks galore!

DIECIDE "Amon: Feasting the Beast" cd, Roadrunner

So I've been listening to a lot of "death" lately. Amon is Diecide before they was Diecide. This is a comp of early demos that sounds way fresh even today. Maybe death hasn't gone very far since these were recorded but then again, who cares. Brutal and I wouldn't do without it!

DROP NINETEENS "Your Aquarium" Caroline

This disc really wasn't the greatest thing in the world, but it had its points... 1) They did a Barry Manilow cover, and 2) they did it good. Not many bands do good Barry covers, but their's was cool. Wish they would've just made a Barry cover album. (DIGS)

FACE TO FACE "Don't Turn Away" lp, \$7 to Dr. Strange

P.O. Box 7000-117 Alta Loma CA 91701
Much anticipation for this release. Imagine Pegboy with the same melodic punk force, the same drive, the same emotion only with an even more buzzsaw guitar sound and even more energy. They've increased the pop punk influence here on this red vinyl slab. I can't sit still when I listen to this band. Wahoo!

FAILURE "Comfort" cass. Slash

I can't believe a major is cool enough to put something like this out, we are truly living in extraordinary times. I really hope this doesn't get overlooked. Powerful like Tar, but reaches farther. Has a very Chicago feel. Steve Albini produced it and gave it one hell of a sound. Big emotional deep shit. Was in my tape deck for at least a month!

FEAR FACTORY "Soul Of A New Machine" lp, Roadrunner

Fuck yeah. Politically correct death metal? Combine the growl and heavenly monotone vox, death guitar sound with Metallica, thought provoking lyrics and world conscious mindset and you've got one of the strongest things ever released. It can be very tense at times. I could feel the muscles in my back contracting as I listened to this. I need to release after hearing this. Big time. Total aggro.

FUDGE "The Ferocious Rhythm of Precise Laziness" Caroline

I really took a liking to this disc. Dreamy guitars, drums, everything. Kinda Smashing Pumpkinsish. The cover featuring a kid eating a fudgepop would sell this disc to all of the mom's in America. And they got a song called "Mystery Machine," to clue in all the non-cartoon buffs out there, that's the Scooby Doo van. Now ain't that sweet! (DIGS)

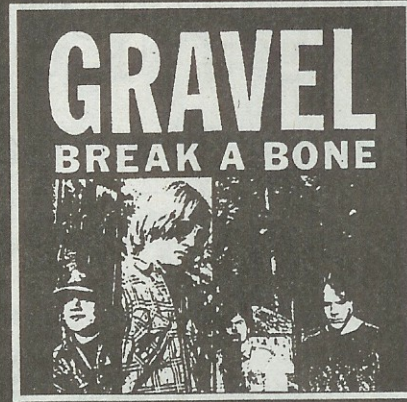
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RECORDS

GANGWAY "The Hidden Agenda" cd

There is a fine line between whether a disc will be listened to once and filed away or it is grabbed for repeated listens. These tunes rock and are good songs. But I know this one will gather dust, though it really doesn't deserve to.

GORGUTS "The Erosion of Sanity" cass, Roadrunner

Although this band will probably fade from your memory in a year or two, if you're looking for basic death heaviness with songs titles like "Odors of Existence", this works tremendously!

GOD'S FAVORITE BAND "In Through the Out House" cd Restless

Great fuckin band is more like it! Anybody who writes a song about fishing (cutbait) is king in my book! Guitar the way it should be played ala rock and Minneapolis roll! They take it to both ends of the spectrum by burning it on the surface to crawling it over structure. And if I can throw in one more fishing term... this cd should stay in the "strike zone" for quite a long while cuz they're hot baby... Hot! (Kale)

GWAR "The Road Behind" ep Metal Blade

The title track is god, taken from their last lp. The live rants before "Have You Seen Me" are meant to offend, just like everything the band does. I wonder how far they are going to have to go the next time they are out to offend, will they get caught up in their act, and actually kill someone, rape someone, end up like GG or Manson or like some humble nobody busted and locked up in the County pen? The live material is recorded real crisp. Worth it!

GRIMACE "Tomorrow's Gonna Suck" Gift

Mysterious! Unknown! Like a deep dark secret that you always wanted to find out about! Trippy feeling with a grungy touch. Pulling you in and spitting you out. Then boom! The singer appears whiny raspy, sounds like somebody you always wanted to kill. You pull it out and listen to someone more pleasurable like, like Barry Manilow! (DIGS)

GUTTERSNIPE "Hairy on the Inside" cd, Progressive

If this bands name sounds like a "punk" name, then the title fits the tunes. 70s punk with a 60s pop influence that gives it a way groovy shoulder swiveling feel. Upbeat, clean production. Cool.

HIGH BACK CHAIRS "Curiosity and Relief" cd Dischord

Includes the two classic songs on the single plus four more which cross the hokey line. Very rockish and very pop almost to an REM point. "Summer" and "FUJ" make the disc worth moving up to from just the 7" tunes.

ICE CUBE "The Predator" Priority

Don't miss out! This is one of the best rap discs to ever be released. Hard, you ain't heard nothin' this hard. My #5 fav. disc. of 1992, kick butt beats, great original samples and the disc is opened by a sample from the movie "American Me". Yeah! Controversial, think maker. A must!

LAUGHING HYENAS "Crawl" lp, Touch and Go

Fucking the most incredible band ever to be witnessed live! John's vox and presence, Larissa's guitar amazement. This is tight rock, blues punk noise aggression. Immediately memorable. I am a disciple of the ruckus.

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JESUS LIZARD "Liar" lp Touch and Go

So after a bunch of releases how could the J.L. put out anything worthwhile. They should be burned out. I don't know how they did it, but this still sounds fresh. Still creative, still worth getting. David Yow's pain filled vocals, the powerful rhythm and the wizardry of Duane on guitar who's sound is haunting. Dig the history. This will be one of the most influential bands ten years from now.

LEATHERFACE "Mush" cd, Seed

Duh. A sure hit if I ever heard one! Cross Motorhead with Anti Nowhere League and make sure you keep up the punk fire. Cover "Message in a Bottle." Yow! Biff! Bam! Pow! Lyrics are neat even. Anthemic, touching, rocking. The jokes on you if you don't pick this one up.

LUSCIOUS JACKSON "In Search of Manny" cass, Grand Royal

Kate was the original Beastie Boy drummer, Pollywog Stew era. They sample the king, Schooly D. Its good rap, mostly cool, with a bit of the Me Phi Me acoustic thang going on.

NEW BOMB TURKS "Destroy Oh-Boy" lp Crypt

Wahoo! Friggin' raw as my skin after standing out in the summer's sun for a few hours and then taking some high grade sandpaper to it! And then walking into a pet store! Yeaow am I allergic to those friggin' cats. Ferocious punk with the rawest buck naked guitar sound! Makes me wanna run full speed into a brick wall, head first, yelling yabadabado! For those who like their lovemaking sweaty.

MULE "Mule" cass, Touch and Go

Well you know they scared me live. Country twang aggro punk with powerful rhythms by the insane. And that's a fine fine thang.

NO FX "White Trash, Two Heebies and A Bean" cd, Epitaph

This is a must! Quick punk rock blasts all very competent all very rockin'. "Straight Edge" is a classic! The friggin' coolest song I've heard in ages! You've got to hear this bluesy/Osmonds tune. Fun fun fun! "Please play this song on the radio" is great too! Get this now!

NO USE FOR A NAME "Death Doesn't Care" ep, "Don't Miss the Train" cd, New Red Archives

I really liked this single from these CA guys. Its melodic, sorta like Bad Religion on downers so to speak. For live tracks, its a real good recording, but the clapping sounds real overdubbed. But I ain't one to say anything.

The lp smashes the cd single to shreds! Good midpaced melodic HC with a grungy recording feel that I love. This band sounds really original and should be noticed. If they keep coming up with releases like this, they will get noticed! (DIGS)

ORIGINAL SINS "Out There" cd, Skylad

BOX 666 Middlesex NJ 08846

I don't know. I love the Sins. They rock hard. This I think is their best! JTs distinct vox, those keys and it just drives. The songs are memorable, singalongable, rockin, grungier than anything hitting the majors and bassy, 60s feel, but totally now. I love it!

PIGFACE "Fook" cd

Industrial madness or trippy noise? Pigface is a band made up of some of the best people in the industrial business, but on this disc, they must of had a bad time in the studio. Check out some of their earlier releases or buy the soundtrack to Saturday Night Fever. Dance on. (DIGS)

PIGPEN "Prick" cd, Restless

Equal amounts of stupidity like "Diarrhea", gusto cool groove like "Husband and Wife" and aggro noise with clean guitars ala Tar, and hate for people equals one great disc. They had a 7" on Vital Music and deserve your attention.

POP WILL EAT ITSELF "The Looks or the Lifestyle" cd, RCA

I wish somebody would eat these guys. All the looks that you would expect for the Lifestyle. (techno pretentious disco poo)

RHYTHM COLLISION "Now" lp, Dr. Strange

Yo, punk. Solid straight ahead full speed punk. If you like the band you'll not be disappointed. If you've never heard of em...

Hmmmm. Smart people know about them, but I'm not saying anything bad about you, oh no... I would never do that... I respect your ignorance, sorry someone told me to say that. Someone who thinks this band should be bigger than they are, and rightfully so.

ROCKET FROM THE CRYPT "Circa: Now"

cd, Cargo.

SASE for catalog, 4901-906 Morena Blvd. San Diego CA 92117-3432

As hook laden as the best 120 minutes college hits but with twice the energy. As fast as any punk jem the Damned ever put out, with just the right amount of controlled chaos. Tight. They must be gods live. Get hip to the crypt, you won't regret it. Cool sax usage.

SAMIAM "Don't Break Me" 10", "Billy" lp Red Archives

I've got my first favorite lp of 1993! Acoustic type versions of old Samiam tunes on a 10". Plus the title track from the great new lp, and other rollicking punk rock emotion thangs. Mucho respect and admiration is due for doing this. They've got so much heart in these songs I want to cry. The Cure wish they had it going on like this. "Billy" is emo all the CA way. Guitar power, distinctive vox, tight. This can get tiring after awhile, cuz it is a mood record. And that's not a fault, cuz when you're in this mood, kinda reflective thang, this is king. Green vinyl.

SANDY DUNCAN'S EYE "s/t" cd

Flipside PO Box 60790 Pasadena CA 91116

X rated teddy bear (male) on the back cover. Creative guitar work, aggressive, tense... Can't compare em to anyone... All I can say is that its been on my turntable a lot. CA meets DC in the current rock influenced area... and its highly listenable too.

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JAWBOX

WOOL "Budspaw" cd, External

So I interviewed them this issue so you know they kicked my butt straight outta Bath to Bethlehem! Rockin' powerful shit, with a ballsy bass sound and production that makes everything clear without stealing any of the intensity. Cool lyrics. If you craved the intensity of Government Issue and early Scream here it is, plus they've added a maturity that proves you can be angry and "mature" at the same time. The phone thang on the lp is fucking great!

VARIOUS D.I.Y. series on Rhino cds

This looks to be a fuggin' killer series for what it is. I only have a sampler disc with 2-3 songs from each disc. 9 discs featuring punk, pop - power pop (UK and US), Boston, NY and CA features all from 1975-83. Take a look at the track listing and see what you need! This would make a great box set! My only question is why didn't they make a disc #10 for hardcore? That was the REAL DIY dammit! I'm pissed! I am offended! But I'll still kick out the cash for some of these babies!

VARIOUS "Discharged" cd, Progressive
Oh Yeah! Discharge as you know from reading FOE in the past is one of my favorite bands! These 9 bands cover Discharge's early tunes. You know the ones from "Why". Well these versions blow those away. Most are done in a HC/grindcore, ultra heavy way, which is way cool. Concrete Sox come thru with some intense versions. As do all the bands. This is a must if you like the current crop of noise mongers whether you like Discharge or not!

VERVE ep, Caroline
This is real, I mean real trippy. Total 60s psychedelic played in the 90s. Laid back and dreamy with cool buildups. If you think you'll ever have the occasion to listen to something like this, you'd be missing out on the chance to float through the walls, cuz this will give you the power.



STYLE MONKEEZ "Schmelt Fry in Antigo" cd
Horrible version of Big Black's classic "Jordan" on this.

SUPERCHUNK "The Question is How Fast" and "Mower" eps Merge

The big secret to Superchunk is that they are great. No big tricks. Ballsy guitar chording, cool leads and key feedback areas, sincere vox, jumpy rhythms, awesome buildups and they rock and groove. The title track on the "Question" ep is from their new lp. There's two non-lp tracks that rock enough for you to shell out the extra cash to pick up the ep. "Mower" is a much better thang for my docket even tho' I wouldn't do without either. Its a little rawer and the live extendo version of "Fishing" is friggin incredible! I think "Mower" is about mowing the lawn and smacking up a robin's egg, even tho they "don't know what they're saying". My Mom can identify with that song seeing as she's killed many a newborn with that Wheelhorse of hers.

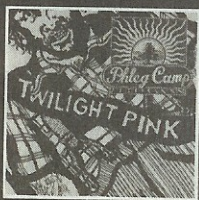
TAR "Clincher" cass, Touch and Go

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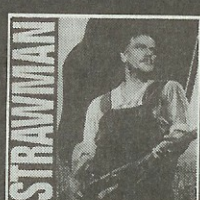
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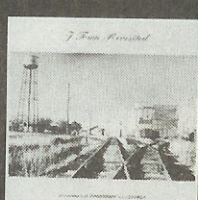

Singles are definitely making a huge come back. There are tons out there. Hopefully my record label will make great strides in 1993 and I will have to get someone to review the singles that I release! All reviews by Frank FOE.

AGENT ORANGE "Electric Storm/Skinny Dip"
PO Box 16385 Encino CA 91416

Listening to this I picture these guys playing on a big stage in a club where everyone is waiting for the headliner... which is a shame cuz they ruled my world ten years ago. The A-side reminds me of a less inspired "Last Goodbye". B-side is a classic type punk surf tune that's been played on ESPN.

ARCWELDER "Raleigh" Touch and Go
PO Box 25520 Chicago IL 60625

This looks like a Big Black single. Combine Tar's guitar density and pummelling, the jump up and down of Superchunk, the smoothness of an early 70s pop rocker, the flow and abrasiveness of Bob Mould and this comes across totally demented. T&G is getting some scary bands (see MULE). Where have I been, these guys have 2 lps out and another on the way. I've got to do some searching!

BARBIE COMPLEX "Dead Rabbit/Now" Fishfur Records 191 Baltic Street Brooklyn NY 11201

Slow, attempting to be powerful alterno rock with female vox like the X Ray Specs frontwoman if she was tired. If you like the Gits lp, imagine it slowed down.

BLANKS 77 "Destroy Your Generation"

Headache 53 Myrtle Ave., Midland Park, NJ 07432

If you've been buying "punk" records for a decade and a half, you might be ho-hummed by this. But if you're not tired of "punk"-styled rebellion with a groove hot enough to make you do the twist, this is right up your beer bottle smashed, anarchist graffitied, homeless excremented on alley!

BLOODY MESS & THE SCABS "Empty"
Black and Blue

Suite 152 400 D Putnam Pike Smithfield RI 02917

Dirty punk/HC with scratchy vox, at times sounding like the guy from Italy's CCM. I've always associated these lads with the GG scene. Ditto on this release. "Look it or Live It" is a great tune documenting this band.

CATHERINE "Sparkle" Limited Potential

A wondrous guitar noise. Trippy, flowing, feedback usage. Dense. Vox are smooth. Warm and cozy. You could make out to "Charmed".

FRACTURE "Lime" Elbo Head Records

206 Montgomery Ave Orelan PA 19075

These guys ruled when they opened up for Green Day in Philly. The first song is a punk rock classic. They owe a lot to the CA Green Day/Cringer thing but you can also tell they're from the Philly area. Melodic punk. Definitely worth checking into!

FUWAH LLAMAS "Nova Boy" Brick Row

PO Box 4110 Star City WV 26505

Driving punk with power. B side has so much feedback power layered over the punk noise my arms grew numb. Green wax.

GODSPEAKS "Scapegoated and Demonized/Indestructible" Limited Potential
Alterno metal with Janes Adick influences. Didn't detect any heart but its good for what it is I suppose.

GROOVE DIGGERS "All Time/All the Way" Limited Potential

PO Box 268586 Chicago IL 60626

Guitar groove with power and that pop specialness supported by pounding rhythm and lots of emotion. Recalls Superchunk and that's friggin cool with me! A Must.

HIGH BACK CHAIRS "Share/One Small Step" Dischord

These guys should be as big as Soul Asylum. They are as rock, as pop, as cool. These two songs are well written guitar, upbeat tunes. Pop the way it should be. Rockin and catchy and neat-o.

HOLD YOUR DAD DOWN "20 Some Years" Brick Row

Arty college depresso spook rock.

HOUSE OF LARGE SIZES "I'm My Own Grandpa" Toxic Shock

Much more hard rockin' than I remembered them as being. "2-liter Man" kicks some serious muscle car, over priced car speaker pumping butt!

JAWBOX "Jackpot Plus!/Motorist" \$3 to Dischord

The problem with doing year end top 10s is that ten usually ain't enough and a year is a long time to remember. After I got this gem in the mail I remembered that Jawbox's "Novelty" should've been in the top ten long things as well as Distorted Pony's "Punishment Room". Anyhow, when bands click (oh by the way the label on my single is wrong on this 7", its backwards, like Jackpot side is labeled Motorist et al) and get real good and powerful, sometimes the song writing is there but not the energy. These songs rock. They would probably knock me off my feet live, but on vinyl, I didn't feel like breaking things, which these tunes should have made me do. I think I'll rub a scouring pad over the single, that'll give it the rawness it deserves in the production.

JOLT "Lullaby/Jalopy" Shredder 2425 B Channing Way #554 Berkely CA 94704

Multi colored splattered slab of CA punk/HC with scratchy/hoarse vocals, that's got an upbeat fun feel.

KILLTECH "WWIV" 591 Albany Shaker Rd. Loudonville NY 12211

Noiserock a la bad Surgery.

LEONARDS "Move" Red Planet Records

2531 Sawtelle Blvd. #49 Los Angeles CA 90064

Who'd'a thought that a band named the Leonards would kick out the jams like this. This is RPR's 2nd single in their singles club thang and it rocks! Like early Lemonheads! For more information on RPRs club call 1-800-PLANET 4. It really works, last time I called they were playing the B side of this record, which is a melodic slower head bopping song. Too cool! Call today!

MASS "Godsend" Cargo

Jangle Euro-pop played by substituting the jangle with noise guitars for an effect like TAR. Flowing, smooth. Yet harsh and aggressive. Very cool stuff. Full length thing PLEASE! Red wax.

MULE "I'm Hell/To Love Somebody" 1/4 Stick

A couple of guys who used to be the rhythm section of the Laughing Hyenas are in this band. I saw Mule last year. They were the first band to actually scare me in a long time. They crushed me. I had never heard them prior to seeing the live show. The one guy wore overalls and nothing else, sporting pigtailed and bigness. They kill. I swear it. I bet you'll find corpses in every town they play in. They'll be on every serial killer fan's top ten lists. Yeah the B-side is that tune "you don't know what it's like to love somebody." Get it now before they kill you.

NO ONES HERO "s/t" Crow records

PO BOX 165 Millersville PA 17551

Heavy guitar sound, Half Lifeish. Powerful HC with metal/mosh influences. Hard. Lyrics are bumme kind of things that go well with the singles cover. Nice to see some not so positive core. Life can be a downer.

OXYMORONS "St. Jude"

PO Box 3445 Dayton OH 45401

This OH band could've been on Very Small or Lookout. I'm telling ya, its cool snappy punk with that drum sound, those vocals, those ohhs. Very worthwhile and a way groovy cover of "Little Red Corvette." Go out and buy some needles for your turntable cuz you're gonna want to be able to play this slab for years to come!

PARASITES "Crazy" Radiation Records

2425 B Channing Way #554 Berkeley CA 94704

The Parasites have relocated to CA, at least some of them. This new single moves them closer to being the next Beatles. Love song with hooks big enough to make ya cry, and still rock at the same time. This rocks big time. The B side is a rip roaring pop punk instrumental. Get everything by this band!

PENELOPE HOUSTON "Sweetheart"

Iloki PO Box 49593 LA CA 90049

Ex Avengers vocalist plays bad country/sappy acoustic stuff. I'm open minded and all but like anyone who wants to hear country gives a fuck about the Avengers and vice versa. Sorry, didn't mean to categorize like that. This just sucks and I can't describe why.

PROPER GROUNDS "Mind Tempest"

Warlock Pinchers meets House of Pain. Funky hard boppin' fun. Real feel tunes. Hard. They're gonna kick yo butt, get on the wagon before it departs from the station! No shit!

RORSCHACH "Needlepack"

Wardance 35-18 93 st. Jck Hgts NY 11372

HC. Hard. Politico feel. Angry feel. Metalish. Noisy. Powerful. Like early COC. Yes!

SCAPEGRACE "Plead" PO Box 216 Port Jeff Station NY 11776

Whew! Intense! Steve Driscoll is one friggin screamer! Musically its a cross between hard NY stuff and melodic angry punk a la CA. Early Neurosis maybe. Cool bass and cool sound. Very worthwhile.

SHUDDER TO THINK "Hit Liquor" \$3 Dischord 3819 Beecher St. NW Washington DC 20007

Wow, this is real disturbing. New guitarist, new drummer. Not how I remember StT. Smooth flowing vocals over stop n go, experimentalish guitar work. Odd structures. Disturbingly enticing. I couldn't take the B side.

SPIRIT ASSEMBLY "Fruit of Hate" Mother Box Records PO Box 115 Millersville PA 17551

A Millersville PA band with the DC/Fugazi urgency meets hardcore pop/punk melodies. The guitar work is strong, the feeling is there, the hooks are there... where are you? White wax.

TABLE "GagBox/Unwind"

Neighbors upset about Oliver J.'s moving into area

A plan to move Oliver J.'s night-club to a former bingo parlor near 9th and Hamilton streets, Allentown, has irked business owners in the area, who are asking the city to somehow prevent the move.

The under-21 club, which was at 7th and Hamilton, is noted for catering to a mix of punk rock devotees and hosting late-night "rap" dances. The events attract hundreds of teenagers each weekend from as far away as Philadelphia and New York.

The club is moving to the Blue Room at 15 S. 9th St because the building where it currently leases space is being repossessed.

The Allentown Parking Authority also recently bid on the Blue Room and planned to demolish the building for a parking lot. But officials said negotiations fell through because of price.

The news disappointed area business owners, who are concerned Oliver J.'s will attract problems such as noise and graffiti.

"We already have trouble on the street," said owner of store on the street.

Lorenzo. "We're as frustrated as can be."

"Basically Oliver J.'s is the most negative thing we can have downtown," he added. "We have had the Police Department and code enforcement people trying to find some way to close down the operation, but all the city agencies say they're within the legal limits."

Michael Ott, the 22-year-old owner of the club, defended his operation saying that in more than two years of operation he hasn't had any problems at the club. Police confirmed that most of the complaints about the club center on noise and loitering.

"I don't think there's anything to be said," Oliver said. "I've been in business 2 1/2 years."

Three subculture types among Wally's regulars

A south side Bethlehem alternative music club has been meeting against the wall. City officials, safety inspectors and south side leaders will meet Monday afternoon with the owner of Wally's Place in an attempt to iron out numerous city and resident complaints about the young adult-oriented music club, including fire code violations and loitering in the streets.

However, Wally's owner and manager, Lemn Kanofsky, said he already has remedied many of the problems and wants to work with the community. Kanofsky appeared in person at the mayor's office Friday morning to request the meeting, in response he explained about the problems he had heard expressed about the club.

During the inspection, Falvey discovered seven additional violations:

- Emergency exit signs were inoperable and needed repair.
- Emergency lighting in case of a fire, was not working.
- The south exit way was blocked, and needed to be cleared both inside and outside the club.
- The south exit and area surrounding it lacked adequate lighting.
- All fire extinguishers needed servicing.
- The northeast exit access needed repair.
- The bar area was in need of a general clean-up.

The report, which was also signed by Kanofsky, gave him 10

days to discuss the fate of the club with the city health and fire inspectors, members of the mayor's South Side Task Force, the South Side Merchants Association and other city officials and residents. Mayor Ken Smith said, "I want the various parties of the club to talk to each other. I want to see WALLY'S on page 4."

Scott Andrews of Northampton is 17, a senior at Northampton Area High School, a member of the varsity track, swimming and cross-country teams, raises Seeing Eye dogs, and is a candidate for admission to West Point. Being an industrious sort, he also works part-time in the produce department of the Weis Market on Catasauqua Road in Bethlehem.

Aileen Bath of Hellertown is 18, plays the piano, and is a student at Northampton County Area Community College, where she studies music composition and theory and listens to a lot of classical music. Her favorite band is Beethoven. At night, she cleans office buildings for Manpower Temporary Services.

Andrews and Bath don't know each other very well, but they have something in common: An overriding love of hard-core punk rock. And they like the music so much, they've taken it upon themselves to become promoters — at least for this weekend.

Bath, along with Mike Kane of Lower Saucon Township, is bringing four Philadelphia hard-core bands — Electric Love Muffins, Dead Milkmen, Home Pioneers and C.O.S. — and one based in Easton, Proper Authority, to the Saucon Valley Community Center, Saucon and Northampton streets, Hellertown, tomorrow night. Admission is \$4, and the show will run 7-11 p.m.

On Sunday afternoon, Andrews is promoting a show at the West Catasauqua Playground Recreation Building on W. Pine Street headlined by Decay, a Pomona, Calif., band that has recently released an album, "Falling," on Toxic Shock Records.

Support acts include Philadelphia's Dead Milkmen; Pleased You're from northern New Jersey which includes the drummer, Adrenaline O.D., a highly paid New York hard-core on Lehigh's Youthful Age; Andrews' own Russian Squats. Tickets at the time scheduled.

In separate interviews, both Andrews and Bath gave the same reason for taking on the responsibilities of promoting hard-core shows: No one else was doing it.

Both said that halls willing to book hard-core acts are few and far between, but neither had an especially hard time getting the locations for this weekend's shows.

Andrews simply contacted the woman in charge of bookings for the one-story frame playground building, which holds about 200 people. "I had to pay \$30 in advance, plus \$25 extra as a deposit to insure compliance with house rules. I'm responsible for any damage. The building doesn't really have a stage; it's just tables and chairs and stuff."

Bath said that over the summer, she used the community center, which can handle "at least 165 people, maybe 200," to practice the piano. "I knew the man who ran the center and rent and talked to him. It seemed a shame to let a good gym go to waste."

"The center used to be a church. Where the altar used to be is where the stage is now."

As for getting to know the bands and how the hard-core scene worked, Andrews said that working last summer as a disc jockey for Lehigh University station, WLVR, "put me contact with

Promoter Aileen Bath of Hellertown said she got the idea for the concert after attending similar shows in Philadelphia over the last month.

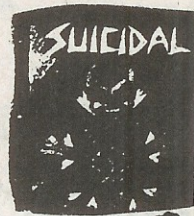
"I attended one two weekends ago at the Community Education Center in West Philadelphia," she said. "More than 300 people showed up with contributions for Philadelphia's food banks.

Train productions

"Shit I'm bored. Lets drink!" "Man I wish the Dead Kennedys would play here instead of Hoboken, N. J. How the hell am I gonna get there? I'm only 12." These were probably just a few of many cries of frustration from the mouths of Lehigh Valley punks back in the early 80's. Fortunately Strain Productions was born and provided an alternative to passing out in the streets and not being able to see your favorite punk bands since they are playing 300 miles away.

Strain Productions got it's start with the help of Scott Andrews (Russian Meat Squats fame), a girl named Gina, John Loftus of the Clap and Johnnie Generic whose namesake derived from his D.J.ing. These people had a vision. They knew they could put on shows just like the people they might have been reading about in various fanzines like MRR. First of all they needed a hall. Previous experience was gained from venues such as The French Connection, G's Beef & Beer and various spots in Northampton. Consistency was gained at the infamous West Catty Playground hall, which Strain got access to since someone knew a guy's mom who ran the joint. OK now they had a hall but how about a soundman? One was selected. Now for the entertainment selection, they needed bands. So they went right for the gold and opted to get big bands to come through. The first really well known act Strain productions got to play was Suicidal

Tendencies. They eventually got all kinds of bands; reggae, speed metal, everything. Strain Productions biggest self proclaimed accomplishment was probably the Dead Kennedys Show. A total of 510 people were in attendance. Other popular bands to come through this neck of woods included 999, Deafy, and Black Flag who's show by the way holds the record for best bar night. All the bands were very grateful for what Strain was doing. Strain liked to treat the bands by getting them beer, salad, hotel rooms and whiskey. Strain was so hospitable it even prompted one band, MIA to ask if they could be the house band here in the valley. You're probably wondering "how did they get the money to do all this stuff?" Well, Strain Productions was financed initially by people chipping in a few bucks here and there. Local Lehigh Valley scene-kids were sole support of all financial doings. Once they started making profits from shows, all the money was put back into doing more shows. Sometimes, though, money was lost due to extra costs. For example, Frank Foe lost his glasses in the pit one time. Frank's dad came down and was really P!od, so Strain had to replace the glasses out of the dough made on that particular evening. But all and all things went relatively smooth. There were no skinheads and no violence to speak of. Unfortunately, after a long series of great shows and great fun, Strain Productions went to the heaven of great punk show promoters and folded. The West Catty playground got sold and there were really no other places for bands to play. Hopefully though, Strain Productions will be remembered as something that did a great deal for the Lehigh Valley punk community and maybe will inspire you to want to put on your own shows or even put out records. (Strain Productions released a single by The Clap who you'll read about later).

Stayin' Alive

LEHIGH VALLEY HARD CORE 1987 - 1989

For me, Punk Rock first reared it's ugly head in 1983. CBGB's may have discovered the Ramones in '75, but my disgustingly white bread middle class life didn't stumble upon the fashionability of the well placed safety pin until eight years later. Many among you may be inclined to snicker at my naivete, but i have yet an even more shameful secret to reveal: i did not discover the LEHIGH VALLEY scene until my Senior year in high school (1987). For shame! Here i was living amongst a punk rock wet dream, and i was too busy with masturbatory punk fantasy to even realize! i missed the Cattysack, i slept through G's Beef & Brew, i was completely oblivious to the West Catty Playground. i simply wasn't around for what a lot of people consider the heyday of LEHIGH VALLEY HARD CORE. So, one may ask, where do i get off writing a LV scene report ???

Here's why : i was lucky enough to make it for the Valley's second wind. The first show that i ever attended was sometime in the spring of 1987 at the Roaring 20's in Southside Bethlehem. If memory serves me correctly, Electric Love Muffin and a few other bands were playing that afternoon, but that really didn't matter. My Grandmother could have been on the bill and i would have been just as awed. That warm spring afternoon i found GOD; i discovered LEHIGH VALLEY HARD CORE. My place in life was set. Well, perhaps i'm overstating my point just a bit, but the importance of that discovery on my life was monumental.

The next few years in LVHC were some of the best that i have seen. From mid-1987 through late 1989 the LEHIGH VALLEY experienced a second coming. The beginning of LV phase 2 was a show at the Cetronia (read: Bumfuckville) Fire Hall that Frank Pearn set up in the early summer of 1987. This was the first show with the RUSSIAN MEATSQUATS new singer, Jeff, and the CLAP made an appearance as well. It was LVHC at it's finest; so good, in fact, that the management asked us not to return even before the show had come to a close. Aaah, the beauty of Punk Rock! Later that fall there were a few good shows at the Music Hall (before it's over pricing policy and corporate attitude). Local Band wise MUGFACE, USER FRIEND, and YOUTH QUAKE/WORD MADE FLESH were the names to see.

Things really picked up beginning in Jan. of '88 with the beginning of shows on the top floor of Goodman building/flea market. Unfortunately, this spot was rather short lived (fire code violations), but it was one of the best examples of consistent DIY ideals that the LEHIGH VALLEY has seen since my induction. Around the same time was the start of Oliver J's I & II. O.J's was not my favorite and rumors of some questionable business practices colored many peoples opinions of the place. However, they did house mega-amounts of shows and put the LEHIGH VALLEY on many out of state punks' travel lists. Notable new bands from this time include YOUR FUNERAL, and FORTHRIGHT.

Wally's Place, perhaps the best and most motivating feature of LEHIGH VALLEY HARD CORE of the time period, first opened it's doors in mid-1988. Wally's was an old Discotheque owned by a mild mannered Lehigh University Professor named Alvin. Why he ever ventured into such an undertaking, why he named the club Wally's, and why the sign above the door always read "Reds and the Boys" has long been a mystery to me; however, thank Gosh for Alvin. LVHC flourished while Wally's was around. One of the coolest Wally's stories involves the night when ALL (with Dave) and the Chemical People were scheduled to play O.J.'s and some locals told the bands upon their arrival that "this place sucks". They informed that a local show was happening at Wally's the same night which most of the LV scene would be attending. The two bands packed up, drove to Wally's and played to a packed and energetic crowd. Wally's was king! Local bands of this period included NO WIN SITUATION, GRUDGE PRODUCT, ATOM WEST (on the metallic side), the REPRESSED, STRAINED EXISTENCE, WHITE NIGGER JEWS WITH BEARDS AND ATTITUDES, WILSON'S WACKOS, MR. YUK (with their ever changing lineup), and ROBOSPHERE.

As with everything else, with the good comes also a little bad. In 1989 there was a stabbing incident that was linked to some local skins and the local news papers over the next few months were ripe with "skinhead" stories; most were in a negative light but at least a few tried to focus on the more positive. Public scrutiny and attitude really came down on the local punks for a while, with most scenesters trying to distance themselves from the both the perpetrators and from "skinheads" in general. Another downer was some out of towners who began regularly showing up and flexing their machismo: New York straights at O.J.'s and Uprise skins (from Philly area) at the end of Wally's. All-in-all, however, these negatives were small in comparison to all of the positive aspects of LEHIGH VALLEY HARD CORE in the 1987-1989 period.

Oliver J's closed in mid-1989 due to dwindling attendance and (unfounded) connections to the skinhead stabbing story. The Goodman building lasted a few months in early '88. Wally's closed it's doors after a GG ALLIN extravaganza in mid-summer of 1989 and briefly opened again that following fall and winter before folding permanently. Wally's was another victim of the dreaded fire code regulations. The Music Hall has apparently finally given up on Hard Core after a white-power fiasco at a recent Agnostic Front concert, though i think few tears will be shed for it's passing.

Where has the LEHIGH VALLEY been in the following years and where is it going? Things stagnated for a while, but they seem on the upswing now. We still don't have a regular venue, but numerous fire hall-type shows keep us going. And new bands such as WESTON, STRYCHNINE AND THE RAT TRAPS, NO ONES HEROS, TURNBUL A.C., JESSICA, SLEDGEHAMMER (and others i'm sure i'm missing) keep us rolling along towards the future. LEHIGH VALLEY HARD CORE R.I.P. -- long live LEHIGH VALLEY HARD CORE. Here's to LVHC phase 3!

Washington's Murderers About Being Gay

ZINE BRIGADE: You want a zine? Where are you going to find a local one? At a show! **CHUMPIRE**, **PUZZLED TO DEATH**, **F.O.E.**, **QUAKER ZINE** were available there. Play It Again had 'em sometimes, but a show was the best place to get them. Most zines in the brigade were completed on the eve of a show. **CHUMPIRE** was almost a monthly; **QUAKER ZINE** was done in time for a show.

SHOW BRIGADE: Shows are important, as noted above. This brigade is highly coordinated. They are always out looking for a hall or park or whatever so they don't have to rely on ripoff joints. They collaborate, they promote heavily, they could always use an extra hand, and that could be you! Frank, Jay Yuck, Eric, Chris Schmitt, and Joe V. are all vets and would be willing to hear from you about a show idea. And guess what? They rely on your attendance to keep themselves out of financial hot water. And none of them would ever put on a lousy show. They haven't yet.

BAND BRIGADE: And bringing up the rear in this strut of spikes; this march of mohicans; this battalion of boots are the bands. Almost extinct in 1990 (like the other brigades), these nabobs of noise are out in force nowadays. Most have tapes (on sale at shows, natch); and have a reason to exist (raison d'etre, if I were a real journalist). Why? Because the entire punk rock division (LV Chapter) is out there writing about them, giving them a place to play, buying their stuff, and playing their stuff to the general public.

So fuck the blisters on yer feet and fuck the ringing in yer ears, soldier. You're marching for a cause. And the cause is independence. Whether it is writing your own youthful opinions, spinning your own wax, strangling your own instrument, or paying attention to those who are doing so, you can't give up now.

Even if you think you hear your momma calling your name.

Let's put it this way. I wanted things to happen this year. I asked for advice and help along the way. From June '91 to August '92, I had done 9 issues of **Chumpire**, been a member of 4 bands (**Sausage Mammy** included) played punk rock on **WLVR**, and finally did 3 shows in the summer of '92. I had time to do all that. Why can't you do at least one of these things?

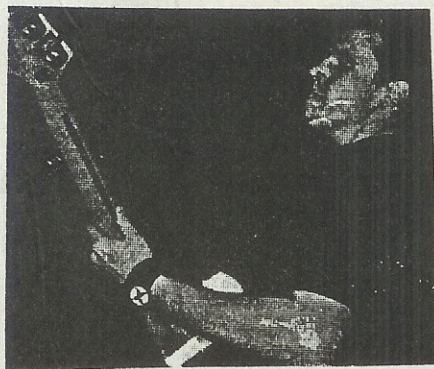

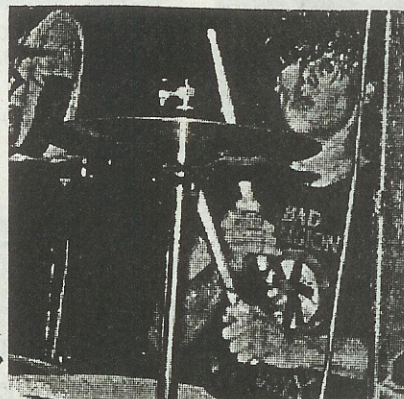
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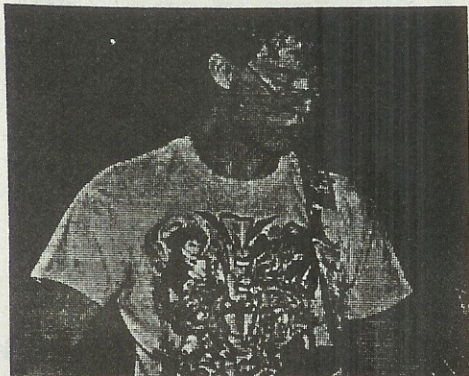

8/1/86 Philadelphia PA
Indigesti, FFM, Homo Picnic, Serial Killers. 100 people, lots of dancing, a good show held in a squatted building since Pi Lambda has been scratched due to a fight between Youth Brigade and Frat Boys. It is interesting just listening to the Italians talking on the way home.

8/2/86 Bethlehem PA
Bon Voyage party at Brian's house. Indigesti performs for all the LV "local celebrities". It is a real trip walking into Emmaus Fire Co. number 3 with a 6'5" Italian skinhead (Stiv).



8/3/86 Washington D.C.
Many hangovers from 8/2. AOD, Indigesti, FFM, Disarm. Only 40 people, a real disappointment since it is AOD's first ever show in D.C. Crowd consists of mostly skin or metal heads. The flat tire on the way home is probably an omen of things to come, we think.

8/4-8/6/86 Lehigh Valley PA
Time to get things arranged for leaving...

8/7/86 Columbus Ohio
Indigesti, FFM at Stache's, a bar. 30 people, another big disappointment, this

being our first real road show. People seem unresponsive to us, but love Indigesti. Ron gets drunk and acts like a fool after the show.

8/8/86 Chicago Illinois
The bands see COC at the Metro for free, thanks to Chris from BCT. Egg & Cheese turnovers at 7-11 in Chicago; the worst food ever created. We stop to camp in a field about an hour outside of Madison.

8/9/86 Madison Wisconsin
Madison is a very progressive, impressive, underrated town - would be a great place to vacation. Girls are not allowed to wear bras here. Steve picks up first 3 Damned singles, and Chris gets first Elvis Costello single, all brand new on Stiff, for \$1.30 each. Indigesti, FFM, Imminent Attack, 25 people, we couldn't contend with Squirrel bait and Volcano Suns at a bar in town for \$1 less than our show. The tour has hit its low pt.

8/10-8/11/86 Lots of places...
Our first overnight drive, arriving in Virginia Beach on the night of 8/11.

8/12/86 Virginia Beach Virginia
Beach day!

8/13/86 Virginia Beach Virginia
It rains, so we go to a mall
packed with more gorgeous 14-18
year old girls than I ever
thought existed. Indigesti, FFM
finally a good show, the crowd
being mostly young skater types.

8/14/86 Charleston W. Virginia
Indigesti, FFM. 50 people, open
air show, the crowd is really
enthusiastic, you can read about
this show in Creem's Feb. metal
magazine (honestly!). Taco Bell
food you read about in Creem was
definitely more important than it
seems.

8/15/86 Detroit Michigan
ASF, Indigesti, FFM, Forced Anger
at a bar. 50 people, decent show
punks get attacked by local white
trash after the show. Decadent
is the word for Detroit. Violent
is the word for Curly. Ron does
some spackling on a roof.

8/16/86 Chicago Illinois
FFM, Indigesti, ASF & about 5
other bands. 50 people. The PA
speakers blow out during the
first band, so Chris does all
the singing for FFM (even though
he doesn't know the words). Why
aren't we playing bigger shows?
Good question.

8/17/86 Chicago Illinois
Indigesti is allowed to play a
few songs to about a million
people at the Metro at a show
with 7 Seconds, Christ on Parade
and Youth of Today. At the post
show party at Eric from Life
Sentences house with all the
bands, members of Youth of Today
can be seen having milk and
cookies (pretty neat). Chris
also quits the band.

8/18/86 Chicago Illinois
We (actually the management)
turn down a free beer and some
money party to do nothing
instead. Christ On Parade de-
cides to hook up for awhile.

8/19/86 Kalamazoo Michigan
Indigesti, FFM, Christ On
Parade. Yes, that order is
correct. For the first of



two times on the tour
Christ on Parade opens
for us (WOW!). 50 people
in a small place, good
show, lots of enthusiasm.

8/20/86 Lexington Kentucky
Indigesti, Christ on Parade
FFM, No Fraud at a bar. 5
people, so only No Fraud
plays. A favorite other
bar in town is closing
tonight so no one is here
Since we have no scheduled
show tomorrow we decide to
stay and tag on to a local
band show.

8/21/86 Lexington Kentucky
Indigesti, Christ On Parade,
FFM, Happy Death at the same
bar. 50 people, a much older
crowd than to be expected
for a hardcore show. No one
slams, so COP and FFM go at
it during Indigesti's set.
Hello Tammy, Betty, Animal
Experimenter, and especially
Wendy (Lexington).

8/22/86 Edwardsville IL
Indigesti, COP, FFM in a
cellar. 75 heavy metal
types throw a basement
party and we are there!
A real unexpected sur-
prise as people go wild,
we get our own keg of
beer and sell tons of
stuff, one guy even eats
bugs for us. COP isn't
thrilled with the kind

of dates we've been
getting and decides to
head home after tomor-
row in Omaha.

8/23/86 Omaha, Nebraska
Indigesti, COP, FFM. Just
what we needed! 250
people jammed into the
Lifticket Lounge. People
even know our names and
lyrics to our songs (what
an ego boost!) The best
night of the tour!

8/24/86 Omaha Nebraska
Indigesti, FFM. 50 people
not a bad show for a Sun-
night at a place we just
played the night before,
on the night before
school opens here. The
reason we're playing here
again is our show in OK
city has been canned due
to a day of mourning for
the mailmen murders. Any
way, Omaha was great!

8/25-8/26/86 Lawrence Kansas
Camping out in a state park
Nature at its finest. Swim-
ming, girlwatching (sunbath-
ers from U of Kansas), beer
and hot dogs by the fire
(oops only beer for FFM). Ron
quits the band this time.

8/27/86 Wichita Kansas
Indigesti, FFM. 7 people
During our 3rd song some
guy dressed in black
starts dancing like you
would to the Cure or
Simple Minds or something,
enough said.

8/28/86 Albuquerque New
Mexico. Recovery from our
all night drive the
previous night.

8/29/86 Albuquerque NM
Indigesti, FFM. 100 people
lots of skinheads, lots of
thrashing, lots of fun.
Lots of controversy at the
party afterwards about
whether to stay overnight
so we can play or leave
so we can see the Grand
Canyon. The Grand Canyon
wins, so off we go.

8/30/86 St. George Utah
Indigesti, FFM, NoFX, FuckShitPiss
100 people and a real good show, despite
many technical difficulties during our
set. We pick up the other BCT Chris here
to make our situation even more crowded.
We are now at a point in the tour (actually
we were yesterday) where the distance be-
tween shows requires us to drive all night.
No sleep til Salt Lake City!

8/31/86 Denver Colorado
FFM, Indigesti, ASF. 100 people, due to "man-
agement decisions" FFM headlines. This is
almost the same show as 8/15 in Detroit,
except FFM and ASF switch places. Manage-
ment decisions backfire and people (mostly
skins again) go wild for us. A great show.
Management Decisions are straightened out
at a tour personnel meeting after the show.

9/1/86 Salt Lake City Utah
Indigesti, FFM. 50 people in the building
behind Raunch Records, probably the best
hardcore record store in the USA. The show
goes ok and the beds feel good later. Ron
has watermelons and crabs for a midnight
snack.

9/2/86 Going to California. Like Led Zep.

9/3/86 3am Las Vegas, 9am Los Angeles,
1pm San Diego, 7pm Mexico. A big day.

9/4/86 Los Angeles California
Indigesti, Uniform Choice, Fang,
Justice League, FFM at Fenders.
(See our album review in the
latest Sporadic Droolings, haha)
300 people, the kind of show you
always read about in Flipside.
Big hall shows are nice, but
those good old crunched in LV
shows are nice too.

9/5/86 San Francisco CA
Indigesti, FFM, Ruin, COP, Miserable
Sex, First Offense at the Farm.
150 people for the big reunion
with COP. Having to go onstage
after Ruin is a real trip (How
do you follow up one of the best
bands in the country? So what if
they're local to us!) The last
show for Indigesti and FFM
together. Technically the end of
the tour.

From herre til home, we
played the Anti Club in LA
and a party in St. Louis as
a 3 piece (Chris flew home
for school from S.F.). All
in all, the tour had to be
the best 6 weeks of my
whole life. Sure it could
have been better, but, hey,
you gotta start somewhere.
If any of you other bands
out there, LV or otherwise
ever has a chance to do the
same thing, by all means,
go for it. Since we've
been back, we've been play-
ing a lot more regularly.
So besides doing it just
for the fun of touring, it
also helps the bands rep-
utation. Anyway, we hope
to go again this year, at
least for a while, if not
for quite as long as last
year. We'll also be recor-

ding again in April, so look for new
vinyl by fall. Finally sorry this took

The Clap (the band uh, not the disease) is a very important chapter in Lehigh valley punk's history. They are pioneers in that they were one of the first "punk" bands in the valley. Plus they influenced a generation of colored hair youth alike. Let us now take a closer look at the Clap (the band uh, not the disease.)

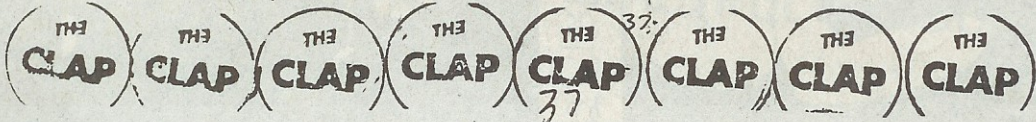
The Clap got its start in 1978 in the attic of singer/bassist John's house. Johnny and friends, Mike/guitar and Rob/drums were nearly reaching puberty when they first started out their favorite cover songs in the attic. Their major influences at the time were the Sex Pistols, Ramones, Generation X and many other English and American punk acts. As far as their namesake is concerned, the three of them agreed that they wanted something controversial and obnoxious. So they went with the popular STD, commonly known as the Clap. They practiced hard and eventually landed their first gig at a Talent Show at Catasauqua High School. They won 2nd prize! The Clap went on to playing numerous house parties until getting their first "real" gig at a club called Carol's Paradise. They got paid \$500.00 and sold out the house. At this point the Clap played three original songs and 10 or 11 covers. The crowd didn't notice the ratio. They were in love and the Clap were invited back.

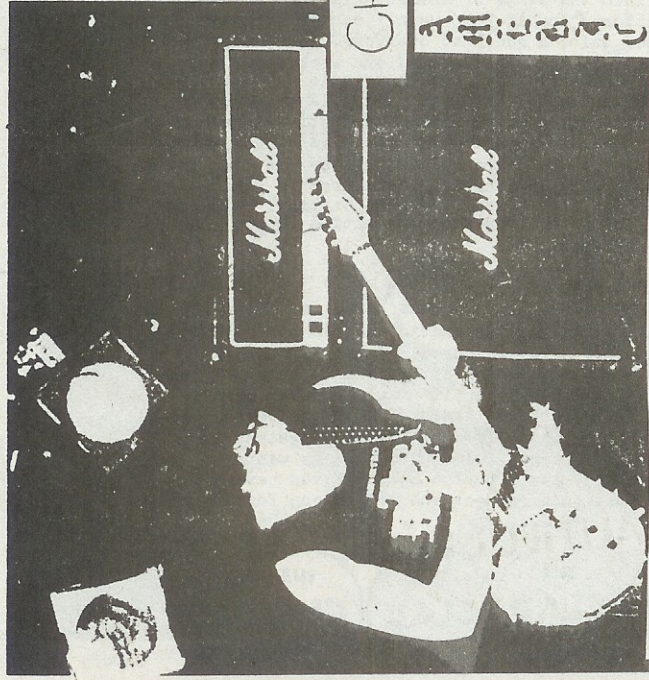
In 1980 the Clap saw the arrival of a new practice space; the basement of a hair dresser (also the arrival of John's hair dyeing spree.)

1982 was a topsy turvy year for the Clap. That year saw the release of the first Clap single, Don't Say No/Killed by Kindness. It did very well and it presently listed in the rare singles catalog. Then the Clap was plagued with a few troubles and the band took a rapid downshift. First of all the Clap became victims of theft. Their guitars got stolen by some creep. For 8 months they had to deal with this thorn in their paw. Miraculously though, with help from the police their equipment was returned. But, just when the Clap was starting to get back into the swing of things, Mike the guitarist had to get a serious stomach operation. And if that wasn't enough, drummer Rob's brother died of cancer which was quite a shock to everyone. So things were slow for awhile until the dawn of the West Catty Playground era where the Clap were showcased numerous times. The band went back into the studio to record some new material. The songs "Skinheads" and "Confusion" which is on this CD compilation were recored at this time. "Skinheads" is an anti-skinhead song written by John displaying his anger towards the baldies that plagued other areas at the time. "Confusion" was The Claps reflections on the "decline of western civilization" and how punk was starting to take a drastic plunge. If you search long and hard you can find these two songs on vinyl which was released by a California label who never forwarded royalties to the Clap since the label folded shortly thereafter.

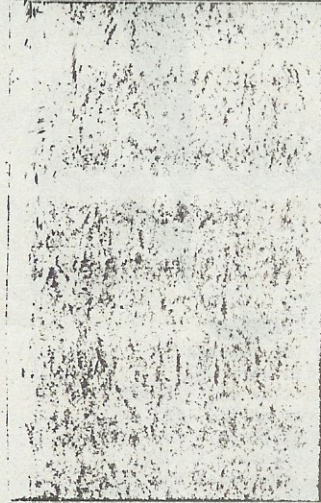


Today, the Clap still credited as one of the 1st punk bands in the Lehigh Valley and longest lasting, consider themselves dysfunctional. John's metaphorical explanation. "The Clap, like the disease never is cured, always lurking in your bloodstream." So there could be a Clap reunion at any time, but any further progression as a unit probably won't happen. The split up of the Clap lied heavily on personal problems. The Clap celebrated their 10 year anniversary at DJ Bananas in April of 1989. This was the last time they played together in front of an audience, though they remain friends. John tells me he wants to start a new band with Mike the guitarist. Well here's to the Clap (if you have a drink, hold it up), a band that deserves much respect and admiration for all they have done!





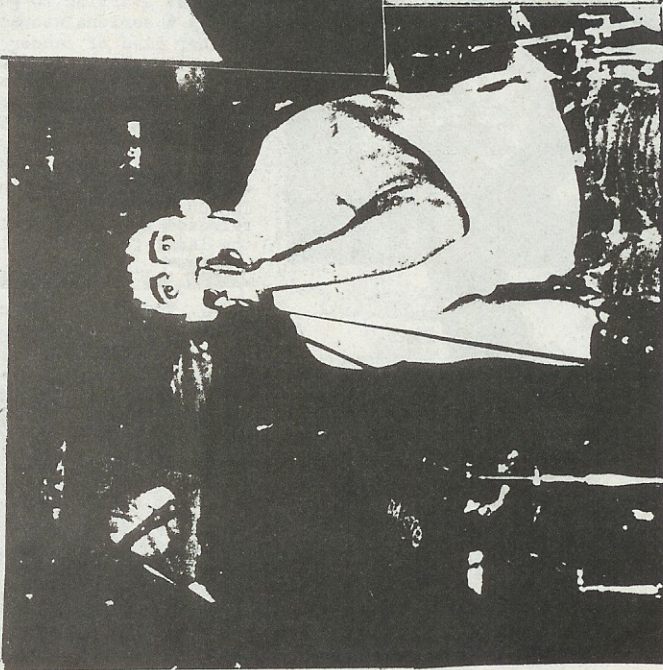

Rehearsal at Mark's pad: Chuck and Dana stood on the bed, Mark stood in the hallway, Trent sat on a Charles' Chips can, and Kevin had the rest of the room to play drums.

Soundchecks at Wally's: long and arduous nights hounding Phil the soundman until he nearly burst into tears. Playing set three times until fully satisfied.

Trent nearly sings "Sweet Child O Mine" for RUSSIAN MEAT SQUATS, backing out at the last minute, only later to sing it during the NO WIN SITUATION demo sessions.

Question: How ya doing?

Answer: Hanging in like Gunga Din.

Typical after show setting: Mark arguing with ex-girlfriend. Kevin schmoozing with skinheads. Trent carrying out microphone, claiming it's his only equipment. Chuck and Dana doing lion's share of loading out.

Playing with ALL on Halloween: Dave Smalley eyes up Trent's girlfriend. CHEMICAL PEOPLE play louder than anyone has a right to. Chuck's ingenious skinhead costume gets him nothing but cigarette burns and kicks in the back.

Playing with RAW DEAL and UPPERCUT: Shouts of "FUCK YOU" and "SUCK MY DICK" filled the air as Trent resorted to carrying a baseball bat as an equalizer in case the crowd got too "enthusiastic." Kevin, the largest member of the band, is also the one with the most hash marks in his drawers. One dude from UPPERCUT hates us the whole night, one tries to convince us to play with them in New York, the rest smoke cigars and get drunk off their collective asses. Many fights ensue, NO WIN SITUATION are involved in none, thanks to Kevin's fast thinking and getting us a temporary peace treaty with the Allentown skins.

NO WIN SITUATION plays with MR. YUK and FORTHRIGHT: NWS blow everyone off the stage. Many new moshes are created, such as the Ostrich(Brook and Pete), Pizza Man(Brad), Woolly Mammoth(group effort by Steve, Pete, Brad, Chuck, and Trent).

NO WIN SITUATION takes over the stage during a WILSON'S WACKOS show: uninvited by the owners, NWS stormed the stage of Oliver J's and plowed through two songs after being "asked" numerous times to leave the stage area. Many people agreed that was the best NWS ever played. Trent performs numerous cartwheels during the show, all of which seem to land in Pete Wasco's personal space(face).

NWS's last supper(practice): Kevin whines around that he isn't that great of a drummer, searching for support from fellow band members. Fellow band members in turn begin to agree with Kevin, which steamrolls into a full half hour's worth of berating Kevin's rhythm skills. Kevin quits the band that night. Kevin proceeds to remove his drumheads from Trent's drums and leaves. All told Kevin was actually a good drummer, but we were feeling pretty mean and once we got on a roll there was no stopping us...

Discography: made tape in 1988 in a guy's basement.(and his name wasn't Steve) Also appeared on MaximumRockNRoll radio show and OYE comp. tape alongside such legends as FORTHRIGHT.

Where are they now: DANA passes through puberty smoothly and becomes the stud of the local metalcore scene. KEVIN is reduced to a pile of dust after being hit by lightning while playing in a death metal band at Budokan. MARK continues to eat huge quantities of food and can speak a limited amount of Italian in a semi-fluent manner. TRENT continues on his quest to be TED NUGENT, but unfortunately is a vegetarian, disqualifying him right off the bat. CHUCK suffers lifestyle setback when he discovers, to his horror, that he is allergic to caffeine, forcing him to cut off his four liter of Coke a day habit. To everyone's astonishment he kicks it cold turkey.
